



WQM certificates represent a series of course combinations that are often used to show water industry employers academic accomplishments.

Students use the certificates on their résumés in lieu of, or while they are seeking an associate degree. Certificate issuances are free and a great addition to your résumé. Certificates are issued each semester and the deadline for processing is within the first few weeks of each new semester. If a student misses the deadline they can still apply, however, the certificate will not be issued until the end of the following semester.
